CHAPTER 5

John 11:1-44 recounts the extraordinary story of Lazarus. Despite Lazarus being dead for four days, Jesus performed a miraculous resurrection. This story displays the authority of Jesus over life and death. The transformation Lazarus experienced was not only a physical restoration but a revival of hope, faith, and belief in the power of Jesus.

Early encounters with Jesus bring unprecedented satisfaction and rejuvenation. They offer a unique opportunity for divine intervention to reshape destinies and renew spirits. Just as Jesus healed the blind man and resurrected Lazarus, He stands ready to transform lives today.

I had an experience with a sister of mine who came to see me. I noticed that her daughter was crawling at two years old, and I asked her why. We discovered that the child had been wrongly injected, and her vein was stiff; one leg was longer than the other. While examining her, I thought of what to do, and the Jesus girl in me, who believes in all-round possibility, held the leg of the child, anointed and prayed. We were surprised that the leg grew up to become equal with the other. The child walked, and her legs are straight now. The devil almost robbed her of her joy. She is now 12 years old and will be 13 years old in a few months. Jesus healed her early; we quickly took her to Jesus, and she was healed. There are many such cases.

Another one was when she brought her last son, and it was the same situation. JESUS healed him, though after 3 days of consistent prayers; the leg grew again like the other. There are

too many benefits of being in Christ. Walking with Him in raw, undiluted faith can make you a walking miracle daily.

Don't wait; seek Jesus early for healing, renewal, and transformation. Embrace His power and grace, allowing Him to mould and guide your path. Invite Him into your life, trusting in His ability to bring restoration and satisfaction beyond measure.

Prayer:

Lord, touch me and my children for healing, in Jesus name.

Let the resurrection power of God resurrect my life, family, and destiny in Jesus' name.

Lord, straighten the part of my child that needs it with your wonder, in the name of Jesus.

CHAPTER 6

Receiving Jesus Early for Strength

Scripture Reference: Matthew 19:14, 2 Timothy 3:15

Pro 23:26

CHAPTER 7

Scripture Reference: Matthew 25:34

Matthew 25:34

"Then shall the King say unto them on his right hand, 'Come, ye blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world.'"

The foundation is the origin of everything in life. The structure of every entity rests on its foundation – be it a building, marriage, career, life, discipline, etc.

The foundation is the source of strength, determining how weighty the building or life is. Every builder knows that the altitude of a building is determined by the capacity of its foundation. The depth of the foundation determines the height of the building.

If the foundation is not deep and strong enough, then there can be no happy ending.

The foundation determines what the building can carry.

Show me a foundation that's well-dug, concreted, and cemented, and I will show you a foundation that can hold any strong building, no matter how complicated. A deep and well-rooted foundation allows for a strong and lasting building.

The foundation is so important that God had to look for an innocent and godly virgin's womb to mould the incorruptible seed of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Foundations have either blessings or curses prepared within them.

Ahab, the husband of Jezebel, laid the wrong foundation for his children. The males tend to die early in life (1 Kings 21:17-21-26).

Hezekiah, the godly king and grandson of Ahab, also faced the battle of untimely death (2 Kings 20:1-7). He fell into an error that activated untimely death against him, just like all the men in his bloodline. He prayed as a king until he got divine intervention that added 15 more years to his life (2 Kings 20:1-7).

The foundation determines the strength of the building/life and can either speak blessings, curses, strength, or weakness into the building/life.

Many foundations are faulty and are the reason for the trouble of many homes, families, and individuals.

You can hear of children facing the same challenges that the parents once had or families going about in a circle, experiencing the same challenges.

If the weakness in a man's foundation is not silenced, it can continue to confront his strength and reduce him to nothing, no matter how high he goes.

Some get into trouble once they reach a certain age or stage in life. Things get better for them until they reach a certain stage, then the scatter in the foundation rises against their labour and begins to confront their outcome and result in life! The Lord is here to overcome for you in Jesus' name.

Been looking unto the Lord in this situation, and He is ready for everyone who will call on Him now.

Luke 10:19

"Behold, I give unto you power to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy: and nothing shall by any means hurt you."

Some time ago, the Lord revealed this vision to a prophet: The prophet saw a husband and wife in tears, and as prayerful as the wife seemed to be, their situation went from bad to worse. Until God opened the eyes of the prophet, he saw the couple carrying a load, but it is bent on their head. Everyone around them kept shouting on them and wondering why the load would be bent. Unknown to the people that the bent load is not the fault of the couple, their legs were bent, so their load also got bent.

Then the prophet was asked what it meant for the leg to be bent. "Thus saith the Lord: The load represents their outcome in life, but the load is not the problem; the bent legs are, which represents their foundation."

When they get their legs/foundation straightened up, then the outcome of their efforts will be straightened, saith the Lord.

That means the state of your foundation determines your outcome in life.

Prayers:

Let the blood of Jesus Christ flow into my foundation to straighten every bent part of me, in the name of Jesus.

Let the blood of Jesus that is without blemish flow into my bloodline and my foundation, to straighten me up in the name of Jesus Christ.

Matthew 25:34

"Then shall the King say unto them on his right hand, 'Come, ye blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world.'"

Prayer:

I sit together with Jesus at the right hand of the Father in glory, and I manifest my victory in the name of Jesus Christ.

I take the blessings of God given to me from the foundation of the world and activate it in my life in the name of Jesus.

Let the weakness in my bloodline contending with my establishment and stability be overcome by the blood of Jesus Christ.

I am the blessed of the father and I inherit the blessings given to me from the foundation of the world, in the name of Jesus Christ.

That which is mine, written in my name from the foundation of the world, I take it all now in the name of Jesus Christ.

Note: Any life built on the word of God is a life going somewhere to happen for Jesus Christ.

The word of God has life and has soothing power. No matter how wrong, broken, battered, wounded, or even dead a life is, only the word of God can repair it.

There is no life that the power in the word cannot penetrate. No situation is impossible for Him.

Hebrews 4:12

"For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart."

Prayers:

Let the word of God penetrate my spirit, soul, and body to separate between me and any bloodline attachment, in the name of Jesus.

Word of God, enter into my foundation to repair and rebuild me in the name of Jesus Christ.

Jeremiah 10:12

"He hath made the earth by his power, he hath established the world by his wisdom, and hath stretched out the heavens by his discretion."

Unto Him that made the earth and everything in it have I come, unto Him that established the world by wisdom have I come, unto Him that stretches out the heavens by discretion, I have come. Lord, repair and renew me inside out by your word of power, in the name of Jesus Christ.

Isaiah 28:16

"Therefore thus saith the Lord GOD, Behold, I lay in Zion for a foundation a stone, a tried stone, a precious cornerstone, a sure foundation: he that believeth shall not make haste."

Jesus! The sure foundation, I am relayed and renewed in you in Jesus' name.

Luke 6:48

"He is like a man which built an house, and digged deep, and laid the foundation on a rock: and when the flood arose, the stream beat vehemently upon that house, and could not shake it: for it was founded upon a rock."

My foundation is deeply rooted in Jesus Christ, the rock of my foundation. Henceforth, no more shakings, in the name of Jesus.

CHAPTER 8

Scripture Reference: Matthew 7:7

Matthew 7:7 says, "Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you."

Asking is the free ticket given to humanity in Christ to request whatever we want according to God's will, and we have been assured of receiving when we ask.

To seek means to search, pursue, investigate, crave, yearn, examine, and chase. You cannot find the secret to life fulfilment on the surface of the earth; treasures are searched out for. Search for your destiny's treasure through the light of God's word, and you will find it, says the Lord.

The healing of that terminal disease is in the scripture; the secret of the Lord is with those who fear him. You can search out your miracle on the pages of Scripture.

The Lord said unto us, "There is a miracle on the pages of Scriptures; every verse of the scripture has its miracle attached to it. No scripture is a waste; if it's there, then it's for you."

Jesus visited in February 2021 and said, "Look at it, all things have been made ready, go forth and call each one to come and take his. The provision has been made ready. Take it if you want it." Then I saw a large cooker with many faces and a pot sitting on each face, each containing ready food. He said that it has been prepared for everyone, but the choice to take it is ours.

Knock, and it shall be opened, says the Lord.

Nothing can resist the sound of our knocks if we are knocking according to his will. It shall be opened is an assurance word, not an uncertain decree, especially when you allow God's mighty and outstretched arm upon your hands.

These three methods of prayer were intentionally given to us by the Lord Jesus Christ. If you have exhausted the first, then you can switch to the second and the third:

- Ask: Make your request known.
- Seek: Enquire, search, find.
- Knock: Take the bold step, use the door. Heaven's door is big, wide, and large, but it is knock-able.

The kingdom of heaven suffers violence, and the violent takes it by force. Learn to take the bold step in prayer. If you want it according to the will of God and not your will, bombard the heavens with knocks, and it shall be opened. Hallelujah!

This is the free ticket given to humanity, and we have seen and heard of many men who have used it to their advantage, such as Elijah, Elisha, Peter, John, and several others, both in ancient times and in our days. We have used and are still using it to turn the hand of time in our favour.

Matthew 7:8

For everyone that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened.

Matthew 7:9-12

Or what man is there of you, whom if his son ask bread, will he give him a stone? Or if he asks a fish, will he give him a serpent? If ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children, how much more shall your Father which is in heaven give good things to them that ask him? Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them: for this is the law and the prophets.

This scripture draws a comparison between God's fatherhood and that of man. Jesus established the fact that as humans, we may know how to give good gifts to our children. No sane parent would want to hurt their child or give them something harmful. Just as the Father of all Fathers, the compassionate God, will never hurt us; He loves us too much to do so.

But He won't shield us from the consequences of our decisions, as the law of nature has been programmed to punish the offender.

He that breaks an edge, the serpent will bite.

Nonetheless, under the consequences of our sins, if we repent, ask for mercy, and pray to Him to remove the consequences, He will do so gladly.

Father of mercy, I ask for forgiveness of all my sins today, in Jesus' name.

Father, I have come before you to ask, to seek, and to knock. Open to me today, in Jesus' name.

Father, straighten my path, way, vision, and intentions in Jesus' name.
